Description:

Barangay Nutrition Scholars Association (BNSA) was organized in 2008 in order to provide additional income by preparing complementary baby food products. In 2011, the association was registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission and with the Department of Labor and Employment. These Nutrition Scholars are actively working as volunteers in the different barangays in San Jose which includes two small islands Ilin and Ambulong. BNSA currently has 46 BNS in 38 barangays; because of the area, there are big barangays which necessitates more barangay nutrition scholars. In 2014, because of its complementary baby food products, BNSA was awarded third placer as Best Technopreneur SETUP Non Core Category of the Department of Science and Technology –MIMAROPA. Before becoming a full pledge Barangay Nutrition Scholars, one has to be a Barangay Health Worker first. Upon assuming as BNS, one is afforded trainings which will capacitate them knowledge, skills, and attitude on how they will be able to promote good nutrition.
